Last month I wrote that employees come first, customers second. But there is something more important than employees – the firm, in

our case, Kringen Klub. Without it there is nothing. Kringen Klub has been hard hit by inflation the last few years. Food is up 25%, overhead costs even more, and labor is up. This has drained our cash reserves. In 2023 we made some really good progress, but it will take all of 2024 to complete the task and stabilize the Klub for the long term. It takes two factors working together – revenue and margins. Troll Lounge has good margins but needs revenue improvement; Kringen Kafe has excellent revenue (due to our excellent home cooked food) but needs margin improvement; the Ballroom is underutilized.

#### Here are some things we're doing now:

- Food prices will be going up.
- Sales tax will be built into all prices to improve flow through the cash register.
- Switched accounting firms which will save several thousand dollars.
- Initiated a lutefisk meal raffle.
- Have a committee working on Ballroom events.
- Tuesday evening Social Night needs more traffic.
- Working on some excellent new revenue streams, which are needed to close the cash flow loop.

#### GENEALOGY RESEARCH

#### WHAT IS DIGITALARKIVET?

It is the National Archives of Norway offering millions of free records from all parts of Norway - the full CENSUS of Norway, the Norwegian CHURCH REGISTERS, including birth/baptism, confirmation, marriage, death/burial, vaccinations, incoming/outgoing church members and PROBATE records. This is all available to you from your home computer. It is free and no password is required. NOTE: At the top of the page, you may choose to have the print in Norwegian or English. Click English.

In this article, you may follow along with me as I look up my great-grandmother, Rachel Tumine Jonasdtr's birth record and the record of them leaving the church, both included in Minister's Church Registers. When you google digitalarkivet, there may be a picture of church books. If so, look below for a short line that reads, "Browse Norwegian Church Books." Click on that and it should open up to a form on the left side. OR, it may open to "Search for Church Books" on a line. When you click on that, it also opens to the same form on the left side. Not all spaces on the form need to be completed.

For my great-grandmother's records, click on the space under Physical location. Select STAVANGAR; Under County, Select ROGALAND; Under Local Parish, select CATHEDRAL or DOMKIRKEN. Under Type of Record, Select BIRTH/BAPTISM; Under Year, insert 1841, the year she was born. Now click SEARCH, which brings up records available. Look for the year 1841 and click on dp (birth/baptism). NOTE: If you move your curser to each set of initials, it will inform you what they stand for and what years it covers.

After clicking on dp, use the slide at the top of the page to move to the year 1841, then use < and > to move backward and forward until you find her name listed. She was born 4 Oct. and baptized 14 Nov. They are recorded according to the date baptized. She is #235, Rachel Tumine; Father's occupation and name, Jonas Sivertson and his wife, Karen Helena Arnesdtr; Stavangar Church. END OF HER BIRTH SEARCH.

Now we will search for the church record of this family transferring out of the Parish. Go back to the form on the left. Change these records: List type = moved out or out-migrated; Year emigrated: Should be 1857 but there was a mistake here. Insert 1844. The dates 1844 to 1854 should have been 1844 to 1859. Click on uf (moving out records, 1856-1859). Once you find the year emigrated (1857), you will need to search for the family by name or ages. (It is actually #9 on page 369, 15 April, 1857.) The entire family is listed along with their ages. And, where are they moving to? DESTINATION AMERICA!

Now it's your turn! If you don't know your ancestors birth date or year of emigration, you may find it on the 1900 or 1920 census. Fill in the form on the left with YOUR ANCESTOR'S information and begin searching for YOUR records. LYKKE TIL!

I have spent the past 7 months having the time of my life in Norway. Thanks to the Sons of Norway Foundation and the Helen Tronvold Scholarship this has been possible. I graduated from Fargo North in 2023, and I'm spending this school year at Nordvestlandet Folkehøgskole in western Norway, near Molde. Norway has many different types of folkehøgskole often centered around creative arts, sports, or the outdoors. All of these schools give a wonderful opportunity for students to have a break from their studies as they enter adulthood. I have observed how beneficial this school year is for my peers here as we gain new skills, experiences, and friends from all over the world.

Folkehøgskole are not typical academic schools. My only class that is similar to a standard school is a Norwegian language class. Other classes I've taken are map reading, belay certification, and a music group. This different class structure and active participation by all creates the special environment we have at school.

Many of the classes at my school focus on "friluftsliv", or outdoor life. My "linje" or focus area is called Basecamp. For our trips we often go out into the mountains and set up a basecamp from which we go on day trips. In the fall, I did many new things like backpacking, climbing, surfing, and whitewater paddling. I had a lot of cross country skiing experience before this year, but mountain skiing and avalanche safety have been an interesting new area of learning for me this winter. Our most recent trip took us sailing and skiing above the arctic circle for five days. We started in Tromsø and then sailed to different remote mountains. Many of these were only accessible by boat. We took a dingy to shore where we then went backcountry skiing. Highlights from this trip included: sailing with porpoises, swimming in the cold water, and amazing northern lights.

Nordvestlandet is a very special place for me. This is not because of all the cool adventures I have done here, but from all the people I have met. I have made lifelong friends from all around Europe. This is the most welcoming and genuine community I have been a part of. I cherish my time here and I'm so thankful for the lifelong memories.


Class will begin at 10:00 and continue until 3:00 pm. There will be an hour

#### WHO WERE THE FOUNDERS OF THE SONS OF NORWAY? (Part 3 of 3)

Ole A. Russeth (1872-1942) In 1882 at the age of ten, Ole arrived with his widowed mother and brother Peter A. Russeth (1870-1936) at the Selbygg colony in Brooklyn Township. Four years later, the family moved to North Minneapolis. As young men they went into business partnership as owners of a grocery firm, Ruseth Brothers. Ole was the Sons of Norway's first judge. Peter Russeth was also an enthusiastic and influential early member, but did not sign the charter.

John O. Stokke (1860-1954) Born to a poor family in Selbu, John Stokke emigrated in 1881. After a year in Windom, Minnesota, he moved to Minneapolis. A charter member and


inaugural member of the "Sick Committee" he remained an active member of Nidaros Lodge No. 1 until his death


Lewis J Stokke (1857-1929) Another Selbu native, he settled in Windom, Minnesota in 1879, but moved in 1881 to Minneapolis where he lived the rest of his life. He served as the first treasurer of Sons of Norway.

Edvard Vold A member of the original ritual committee, he served as a trustee on the first board. After moving to Appleton, Minnesota, he transferred his membership to Ivar Aasen lodge No. 5.
